would God allow an 18-year-old committed, young lady to be killed in a car accident? Why would a father of 3 young children be taken away? Why would a 2week-old be put through eye surgery? Why do more than 3/4 of women experience the trauma of some sort of sexual abuse and their perception of themselves is greatly marred? Why do only a small percentage of today's children grow up in a healthy emotional environment? Why does an innocent child face anger from a dad who looks like a good Christian? Why didhappen to me? How could a merciful and good God allow things like this to happen? questions could go on and on. Is God really in

control? How can He allow such evil and tragic events to happen?

God's goodness when things turn out well and it is only right to bear testimony of His goodness. The Scripture admonishes us to be grateful people and count our bless-David the psalmist wrote much about the greatness and goodness of our God for which I am very grateful. I am often inspired and encouraged as I look unto the LORD Almighty, the Maker of heaven and earth. where my help comes from.

But is God still good when bad things happen to us or our friends? There are often many nagging questions that come to us, and we often don't know what to do with We feel guilt for thinking this way. We can often try to hide what we are thinking. In fact, it may seem downright apostasy for us to ask the questions with which our heart is struggling. in this fallen world. Grieving takes time and can't be rushed. Grieving needs a patient and understanding community. Yet in grieving, we can worship with openness and

honesty of heart.

I believe God wants us to ask the questions that brew in our hearts. I believe He would like for us to honestly understand the lies that have formed in our hearts through the various negative events in our lives, sometimes even wrestling with Him for hours as Jacob did. As we wrestle with Him, we can find truth: His deep, reassuring and personal truth! I find great comfort in knowing that He understands our humanness and brokenness, but still chooses to love us. When I can understand that His love is not dependent on me and my performance, but is totally dependent on Him and His character, I can receive from Him and He will give me the peace and rest my heart legitimately desires so badly. In this time of wrestling and understanding who He is, it is important to stay in the battle until I come into agreement with Him about Who He is-He is good; He is gracious! His grace is sufficient for me—and you! He cares more for us than we can possibly imagine!

Part II

In an earlier issue we looked at how Elijah became severely depressed immediately after being used mightily to show God's power. When he listened to Satan's lies, he ran in fear. Even this prophet of God, whose ministry was characterized by miracles, spiraled downhill when he began to listen to voices such as, "Your work has been for nothing. It's no use. You're not protected. You're all alone. You'd be better off dead." God's still small voice proved a much stronger force than either the most destructive forces of nature or the

worst Satan threw at him. When Elijah received the truth God spoke to his heart, he was again able to face life with confidence.

Elijah's feeling of being alone is understandable; he was, after all, traveling alone with the threat of death over his head. Loneliness is a natural response to feeling alone; there is no wrong in feeling its sting. But his thoughts became a problem when he allowed aloneness to turn to isolation. I also tend to think negatively when I focus on myself or my situation. I withdraw into myself, thinking about the things I wish I could change, the things I can't or don't do, what I wish to receive from others. The voices say things like, "You have to face this on your own. Things will never change. It's all your fault. It's no use trying." Isolation becomes the destructive cycle when I listen to these voices, robbing me of the desire to do one of the few things that can help-reaching out to others. If I let others enter into my life by becoming involved in theirs, isolation is banished.

God can turn loneliness into a positive force in our lives if we allow Him. Aloneness can become soli-

tude-intentional time alone for reflection and seeking direction. It is drawing strength from time alone rather than allowing it to sap us of energy. Consistently hearing God speak His truth into our hearts in these times helps us develop proper perspective. "You are my son. I delight in you. I know the plans I have for you. I can redeem your mistakes." Which voices we listen to will make a significant difference in the direction our lives take and the energy we have to face the tasks God places before us. Let's make sure to tune in to the Voice of Truth.
