Following are some testimonials that we received from individuals who took away principles from the seminar week and applied them. Thanks again, John Regier, for giving your time and energies to our community!

From the Seminar:

"We are so thankful for the opportunity of having been at the Caring For The Heart seminar! God did so much for us that week and continues to work in our hearts. One of the very exciting breakthroughs for us was with our daughter. She had been struggling with an area in school and we thought we had to do therapy to overcome the problem. During the week, the Lord revealed to me (the mother) how much control, expectations and performance I have placed on her and how it was affecting her. Whenever she felt the pressure, she would have a mind block. As I sought her forgiveness and prayed with her not only for what I had placed on her but also for what had been passed on generationally and from others, God was doing an amazing work! He took away the mind block and the next day she did her work ten+ times faster than ever before. We continue to see a new daughter in her schoolwork and daily life.

We thank and praise God for His miraculous healing & forgiveness!

From the Training Day:

Two times soon after the seminar with John Regier we were able to apply the principles of caring for the heart. Both times the Lord Jesus ministered in a very real way to the needs of the moment. We hadn't had time to study these principles enough to feel ready to apply them to real life situations, yet we discovered that the Lord Jesus wasn't limited by our inexperience! In the first place, the hearts of both ladies opened up when we told them that we really wanted to care for their hearts- just as John Regier had indicated.

Ann's (not her real name) mother had left the family when Ann was very young and she doesn't remember when it happened. She shared her story of struggling with regrets about the bad decisions she made as a young adult and her mixed feelings of rejection and bitterness towards her parents. As the hurts of her heart spilled out, it became evident that this was an opportunity for Jesus to begin healing a broken heart. Yet I hesitated. Would Jesus really listen to me in such a specific manner? My wife and I chose to believe Jesus, and ask Him if He would show Ann if He was with her when her mother left. In a very real way Jesus showed to her that He was there. We asked Jesus to heal her heart of that memory. Again she experienced His tender touch. We know there is much ground to cover, but it was so encouraging to see our Lord ministering in such a clear way to Ann's heart.

Beth (also not her real name) has experienced numerous traumatic experiences in her life time. One time during one of these traumatic periods, she unthinkingly told it to a friend, and authorities were notified. Due to severe threats to her parents, she lied to the authorities and said there was nothing to the story after all. Again, as Beth shared her heart-rending story, we saw an opportunity for Jesus to bring healing to her heart. As we prayed, she saw a Godly lady who had been her neighbor when she was a little girl. In that way God showed her that He was with her at that specific time. Beth also faces a long journey of healing and restoration, but we praise the Lord Jesus for clearly answering our mutual prayer for touching her heart at that specific moment. Both of these examples have confirmed the trustworthiness of our Lord which is not limited by our inexperience!

A Heart Of Compassion

Matthew 9:36 But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were weary and scattered, like sheep having no shebherd. (NKIV)

I have often been challenged by Jesus' heart of compassion for people even after a long day of interaction with them. While it is true that we need time away from people at times to rejuvenate, I believe it is possible to maintain a heart of compassion for others. I believe Jesus could do it because He was here to serve others, not to serve

Himself.

What is compassion? A dictionary definition is "a feeling of deep sympathy and sorrow for another who is stricken by misfortune, accompanied by a strong desire to alleviate the suffering." The Greek word for compassion in this verse has the idea of feeling sympathy, or to pity.

So how do I as a follower of Christ show compassion to others? Does it just happen because I am a Christian, or does it happen by surrendering myself to the Lordship of lesus Christ? For me, having a heart of compassion doesn't just happen. In fact, my natural response to others is often one of frustration and exasperation at the "problems" of other people. I find it so easy to look at the outward issues and tend to want to address those rather than allowing God to give me a heart of compassion for them. If I address an issue with the idea that they should just change an outward behavior, it will most likely discourage them. Often people know their responses are wrong and don't need to be told.

I believe often what people are wanting is someone who cares

about what is really going on inside. When the Samaritan woman at the well saw that Jesus cared about what was going on inside, she opened up to Him and told Him a lot of her life story. Jesus could have addressed her sinful lifestyle, but instead I see a heart of compassion for her and as He did that, she recognized her need of what Jesus had to offer.

As I see it, I need to surrender my life to the Lordship of lesus Christ and ask for Him to fill me with a heart of compassion for others. I want to learn what it means to have a heart of compassion for others no matter who I relate to. whether it is my brother or sister in church, the person I meet once in life, or my wife and children. "Lord, give me a heart of compassion." It is a blessing to know that it is Nevin and Joann's desire to show the compassion of lesus to all who come to HOPE Ministries. God Bless!
